

FEET ON THE GROUND


"Until next week, keep your feet on the ground and keep reaching for the stars!" Not today's scriptural wisdom, but legendary DJ Casey Kasem's sage advice, heard across America for generations, *American Top 40*'s challenging sign-off. Though Casey wasn't quoting scripture, today's Acts of the Apostles offers similar advice. As Jesus ascended, disciples "were looking intently at the sky." Wouldn't we prefer a soul-relaxing gaze into peaceful blue skies to a heart-breaking focus on this blood-stained earth? But heavenly questioners asked Jesus' first disciples, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" Earth awaited their mission! While our hearts should "keep reaching for" heaven, we need to "keep our feet on the ground." Ascension's scriptures and the Jubilee of Mercy remind us: the Jesus we revere as "ascended into heaven" lives right here among us on earth, awaiting our recognition and loving service.

Our first reading from the Book of Acts accomplishes two purposes: First, it is the introduction to all that will follow in that book; and, second, it is the account of Jesus' Ascension into Heaven. Interestingly our Gospel reading from Luke is the very end of Luke's account and it, of course, ends with Jesus' Ascension. Those two readings could not be more closely associated.

In these reflections we attempt to briefly connect us to the readings and to point out how they are substantial in relationship to a stewardship way of life. There are some key elements to Jesus' Ascension to which we must connect. Why did the Lord depart earth in that way? He could have simply vanished or dissolved, or left in any way imaginable.

However, most scholars believe that He wanted the Apostles, and He wanted us through their witness, to see Him leave physically and to see Him leave in such a way that we would know He was physically gone. However, His last words are: "I am with you always until the end of the age." He is there for us every day and every moment. Through the Holy Spirit He will provide us the strength to be good stewards. We must pray for that strength and then use it to do what is right. (*Catholic Stewardship Consultants*)

How does God bless us? How can we give thanks for these blessings?

Vacation Bible School Program


From Crissy:

I thought it might be helpful if I shared some of the history of the VBS program that we will be using here at Saint Stephen this summer (and hopefully the years to follow). I have worked in a parish for nearly 12 years and have been involved in VBS programs every year that one was offered. Year after year, I always had this feeling of something missing. Across the board, I found that children just weren't familiar with Bible stories anymore. The Director of Religious Education and I saw a growing need to teach them these important pieces of our history. But how?

We both searched for programs to offer that fit our vision of sharing and immersing into Scripture and how God worked through time, but we never could find exactly what we wanted. After lots of research, we decided to write what we were trying to find. The program that we developed will be offered here this summer, and is possibly unlike what you've experienced before.

Each year, VBS will pick up where the previous year left off. This year is Year 1 of a 7 year-cycle that works through most of Scripture. We'll cover the major stories of Adam, Eve, Noah, and Nimrod. We are immersing children into Bible-times. We aren't just *telling* children about these people, we are dressing folks up to *be* bible characters and share first-hand experiences of how God has been working through time.

This program needs lots of volunteers for a successful week. This is designed to help relationships and connections begin to form across the generations in the parish to strengthen the community. There are opportunities to *slow down* and learn from one another. There are intentional moments set aside to *name* where we see God working in our world. This week can be such a witness to the participants in sharing the working of the Lord in our life.


