Baptism:

Couples wishing to share their lives with one another in sacramental Marriage are asked to call the Office for an appointment with one of the priests. We suggest the first appointment must be scheduled nine (9) months before the proposed date of marriage.

- Is there room in my life for others or am I too busy?
- Do I extend the welcoming gesture, the warm smile?

- Am I open to full, conscious, active participation at worship and in parish activities?
- Do I make an effort to encounter Jesus Christ in the people with whom I work, play, and worship?
- Am I a promoter of social justice?

I. The Spirit Breathes On You: In today's Gospel of John, Jesus gives the gift of the Holy Spirit by "breathing" on the disciples. In the first and second readings we see the effects of the Spirit. In the first reading (Acts 2:1-11) and second reading (1 Corinthians 12:3B-7,12-13), the apostles proclaim "the mighty acts of God" to "Jews from every nation under heaven," and yet, through the power of the Holy Spirit each person hears the message in his/her own native language. In the second reading we hear a listing of the many gifts the Holy Spirit confers upon us. From these two readings we see that the Spirit's work is universal and also particular. The Spirit works within the community to draw people from every nation together in praising God. But the Spirit also works within us individually by giving gifts that are to be used to build up the kingdom of God here on earth. The action of the Holy Spirit enables the followers of Jesus to carry on Jesus mission, "as the Father has sent me, so I sent you."

II. Do I Encourage, Lift Up People? Together with St. Paul, Barnabas extended the missionary efforts of the Church beyond Jerusalem to Antioch, and after much success moved on to other places throughout Asia Minor. After parting ways with St. Paul over issues regarding circumcision and the Mosaic law, Barnabas embarked on other missionary journeys with John and Mark. The word Barnabas means "son of encouragement." Do people see me as someone who lifts up and encourages others, or someone who denigrates and put down my neighbor? You are invited to celebrate Mass on Tuesday, June 11 at 7:00am or 12:05pm to honor this "encouraging" saint.

**Forming Good Stewards**

"To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

Pentecost [from the Greek word for "fiftieth"] is the day the Apostles discerned and accepted the power of the Holy Spirit to proclaim Jesus Christ to people from many nations, cultures, languages and religious beliefs. The people listening to them came from many countries heard the Apostles in their own tongue. Amazing! More amazing is that people with a variety of religious beliefs came to believe in Jesus. Later Paul wrote to Christians in Corinth, a seaport city with people from many nations, cultures, languages and religious beliefs. He told them something so obvious we often forget it: Each of us is a person with a unique array of talents, abilities and gifts that God has given to us to use for ourselves and for others - material wealth, intelligence, artistic talent, athletic ability, the gift of music, and many others. God intends for us to enjoy them ourselves and to share them with others. How are we doing with that?



DISCIPLESHIP: WE ARE NOT ALONE

Have you ever turned down an offer for help, perhaps because you wanted to feel independent or because accepting might make you seem weak or inadequate? Embracing stewardship as a way of life as a disciple of Jesus is not easy; the snares of doubt, sin, and temptation are strewn along life's path. This week in your daily prayer, reflect on the gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord) and consider which gifts you need the most in your spiritual life. Allow the Spirit to be your helper and guide.
