## SACRAMENTS:

### Baptism:

Baptisms are usually celebrated during one of the regularly scheduled Masses. Parents are encouraged to call the parish office before the birth of their child to make an appointment for instructions.

### Marriage:

Couples wishing to share their lives with one another in sacramental Marriage are asked to call the Office for an appointment with one of the priests. We suggest the first appointment must be scheduled nine (9) months before the proposed date of marriage.

### Reconciliation:

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated communally two times a year, during Advent and Lent. Other opportunities for reconciliation are Saturdays from 9:30-11:30AM and 4:30-5:30PM on the Thursday before First Friday, and by appointment.

## THE GIFT OF PEACE

"There arose no little dissension and debate." Did that happen at work this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with coworkers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion . . . even sports. At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give and take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," often encouraged by Pope Francis and even envisioned in today's Revelation passage; and a wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

## Evangelizing Moments by Joe Bland

**What?** "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." (John 14:27) Is there something that the world gives that people mistake for peace?

**So what?** Once when I was still teaching in the classroom I was teaching the subject of Christian human anthropology and human sexuality. We were on the subject of love and I went through a list of various "social ills" such as divorce, depression, poverty, abortion, cheating, infidelity, out-of-wedlock pregnancy, breakups, etc. I posed the question to my students; "Imagine a world where none of this existed, and the honest answer came back from one of my students – it would be a boring world." That answer caught me off guard but didn't surprise me because we are not only addicted to things but we are addicted to the "drama" which comes from these addictions. And living in a world without this drama sounds boring as my student went on to explain. There is a satisfaction in the drama of our life and the peace of Christ sounds boring. Addictions are nothing but an outflow of a false peace that the world sells us. The political and social "dramas" or conflicts in which we live feed this addiction on a daily basis. This, friend, is called insanity.

**Now what?** The peace that Christ proposes and gives comes from within. We first have to know we are loved and let him love us and let him dwell within us. The conflict will not end until the inner conflict ends and we love ourselves. Self-love is acceptance of God's love and we let go of our false self in order to love God and others. Jesus is restoring order within. He is giving us "Shalom" or peace which is gift of salvation or healing. The world gives "peace" when the person is attached to the disorder of this world; this is false peace. When we begin to have an intimate relationship with Jesus he gives order to our lives, this my friends is his peace. "God, grant me the serenity (peace) to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference."


**VBS Volunteer Meeting & Training:** VOLUNTEERS
